32nd Annual Kick Off Launches 2017 Campaign

Anticipating another year of helping thousands of individuals in need of energy assistance across the Commonwealth, the Massachusetts Good Neighbor Energy Fund held its annual breakfast on January 11 to kick off its "Give the Gift of Warmth" campaign.

Hosted this year by long-time Fund sponsor Eversource Energy, the breakfast served as the official start to the campaign, which has a goal of \$500,000 in 2017. Jim Hunt, Eversource Senior Vice President, Regulatory Affairs & Chief Communications Officer, welcomed attendees and thanked all the utilities across the state for their support of the Fund and The Salvation Army which administers the GNEF.

Davis, Divisional Commander of The Salvation Army, who provided insight into the impact the Fund has across the state; and Mary Ellen Molloy, Chairperson of the Fund and Regulatory Relations Specialist for Eversource.

To further illustrate the good work of the Fund, a former recipient shared his personal story about how the Fund helped his family through a tough time when they were in temporary crisis and in need of energy assistance.

Although many of the Fund's sponsoring energy companies provide a donation at various points throughout the year, a number of sponsors closed out the breakfast by presenting their donations, which will ensure that eligible families in need may be helped as soon as possible this winter.

"Since it began in 1985, the Fund has helped a staggering 86,000 households here in Massachusetts," Hunt said. "Let's continue to raise the bar and help make a difference in the lives of families in need of energy assistance across the Commonwealth."

Did You Know?

- The Good Neighbor Energy Fund is available to any Massachusetts resident who, due to temporary difficulty, cannot meet a month's energy expense and is not eligible for state or federal energy assistance.
- Last year, the Good Neighbor Energy Fund helped more than 950 households pay an electric, gas or oil bill.
- Since 1985, the Fund has raised more than \$20.5 million and assisted over 86,000 households in need.
- Sponsoring gas, electric and oil companies support their respective customers' generosity through various giving programs.
- To qualify for assistance from the Good Neighbor Energy Fund, an applicant's gross household income must fall between 60 and 80 percent of the state's median income levels.
- This year's maximum Fund disbursement is \$425 per eligible household per heating season.

GNEF Fundraising Goal Set at \$500,000

Massachusetts residents' support of their neighbors in need was evident during last year's campaign as the Fund surpassed its fundraising goal and assisted close to 1,000 households.

Considering these uncertain times, the Fund's goal for 2017 is \$500,000. It is anticipated that the money raised will help provide energy assistance to more than 1,150 Massachusetts families this winter season.

The Salvation Army, which administers the Fund, is already beginning to see a rise in the number of phone calls from families in need. In fact, the Fund expects to receive thousands of requests for aid this winter alone.

And the need doesn't end with the cold weather. Families in temporary crisis also request assistance with their energy bills even when the weather warms up. The need is year-round.
