# Fund Kicks Off 40th Anniversary Campaign

Celebrating its 40th anniversary year of providing energy assistance to Massachusetts residents in temporary crisis, the Massachusetts Good Neighbor Energy Fund and its sponsoring energy companies held their annual breakfast on January 15th, 2025 to help kick-off its "Give the Gift of Warmth" campaign.

Hosted this year by long-time sponsor Unitil/Fitchburg Gas & Electric, the breakfast served as the official start to the campaign, which set a fundraising goal of \$500,000. Lisa Derochers, Director of Customer Operations for Unitil/Fitchburg Gas & Electric, welcomed attendees and thanked the 18 utilities across the state for their support of the Fund, as well as The Salvation Army which administers the Fund.

"Due to the continued high cost of essentials like food and rent, the Fund is going to be as important as ever this winter season and even into the spring," said Derochers. "The successful 40-year history of the Fund makes me especially confident that we will expand its good work this year and make a difference in the lives of thousands of individuals and families in temporary crisis throughout the state."

Michael Judge, Undersecretary of Energy for the Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs, was a featured speaker at the breakfast. He provided an update on the state's energy initiatives and shared his support for the Fund. The kickoff also featured the following speakers: Kevin Lemanowicz, Chief Meteorologist for Boston 25 News WFXT-TV, who gave his predictions on what kind of weather to expect for the rest of the winter season and the possible impact it may have on the urgency of need; Major Elijah Kahn, General Secretary of the Massachusetts Division of The Salvation Army, who provided insight into the vital role the GNEF plays across the state; and Justin Stearns, Chairperson of the GNEF and Manager of Credit & Collections at Unitil/Fitchburg Gas & Electric. A former recipient of the Fund also shared how the home energy assistance he received helped his family get through a tough time.

- The Good Neighbor Energy Fund is available to any Massachusetts resident who, due to a temporary crisis, cannot meet a month's energy expense and is not eligible for state or federal assistance.
- Last campaign year, the Good Neighbor Energy Fund helped more than 1,325 households pay an electric, gas or oil bill.

- Since 1985, the Fund has raised more than \$25 million and assisted over 96,000 households in need.
- Sponsoring gas and electric companies support their respective customers' generosity through various giving programs.
- To qualify for assistance from the Good Neighbor Energy Fund, an applicant's gross household income must fall between 60 and 80 percent of the state's median income levels.
- Households with a fairly broad income level are eligible for the Fund.
   For example, a household of four can have a total gross yearly income of between \$94,609 and \$126,144 to qualify.
- This year's maximum disbursement is \$400 per eligible household per heating season.

# **GNEF Sets Goal to Meet Anticipated Need**


Massachusetts residents' support of their neighbors in need was evident during last year's campaign as the Fund surpassed its fundraising goal and assisted more than 1,325 households.

The Fund's goal for this campaign year has been set at \$500,000. It is anticipated that

the money raised will help provide energy assistance to more than 1,500 Massachusetts families this winter season and throughout the spring. The Salvation Army, which administers the Fund, is seeing a rise in the number of phone calls from families in need. In fact, the Fund expects to receive thousands of requests for aid this winter alone,

And the need doesn't end with the cold weather. Families in temporary crisis also request assistance with their energy bills even when the weather warms up. The need is year-round.
